10) Approval of Chromebook Bid

In January, we received a total of 8 bids for new Chromebooks. The lowest bidder was Trafera, and based on their initial bid we were able to include additional devices. Trafera total bid was \$230,300, \$216,300 will come from sinking fund and \$14,000 will come from the Device Insurance Fund.

11) Approval of Stadium Lights Bid

Three bids were received for the stadium lighting project. Funding will come from General Funds.

Electrical Maintenance Corporation \$400,000.00 Musco Sports Lighting \$490,000.00 Qualite Sports Lighting \$255,785.00*

+ Electrical Connection (Brint Electric) *Not to Exceed \$40,000

Motion that the CCS Board of Education approve the bid from Qualite Sports Lighting, based on the recommendation of the Facilities Director and Superintendent, in the amount of \$255,785.00, plus additional electrical connection by Brint Electric, Inc. at a cost of \$25,800.00) from General Funds. Furthermore, the Board authorizes 50% payment at issuance of PO to Qualite Sports Lighting in order to receive an early payment discount of \$4,686.00.

We received a total of 2 quotes for fiber to the bus garage, with D&P Communications being the lowest. This will allow for greater connectivity at the bus garage to install additional network equipment such as video surveillance cameras, bus GPS updates, etc. Quote was for \$12,315.86 will come from the sinking fund.
