XIII. Restricted Funds for Capital Outlay

Superintendent Cracraft and the Finance Committee recommend that Clinton Community Schools restrict \$250,000 of the 2020-2021 General Fund to Fund 41 for capital outlay purchases or improvements for the 2nd revision budget revision in April 2021.

XIV. 3% Contributions to the MPSERS Health Care Trust

Clinton Community Schools has an opportunity to accept the Closing Agreement Form 2848 with the IRS to resolve the tax treatment of the 3% MPSERS Health Care contributions for 2013-2026. This form designates W. Alan Wilk as the school's representative before the IRS and to finalize the Closing Agreement on the school's behalf. The Closing Agreement will provide substantiation for districts to continue excluding the 3% contribution from FICA tax. This agreement extends through 2026 so the IRS would not be able to change their stance until after the agreement expires. The IRS fee is \$3,000 per district but ORS will be paying this fee for any district signing the agreement.

MOTION, in accordance with Policy #0172, "Legal Counsel," and the recommendation of the Superintendent, that the Closing Agreement Form 2848 with the IRS be signed and submitted to the Office of Retirement designating W. Alan Wilk as our representative in this matter.
